2021 Conditions for Learning Survey Items, Grades 3-5

STUDENT-STUDENT	<p>These questions will ask you about your classmates this school year. When you see or hear the word “classmates” in these questions, it means the students in the classroom you spend the most time in.</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. My classmates have friends at school they can trust and talk to if they have problems. 2. My classmates have friends at school to play with at recess. 3. My classmates try to make new students feel welcome in the school. 4. My classmates treat each other with respect. 5. My classmates can get along well enough to work in groups, even if they aren't close friends. <p>Response Options: Yes, Sometimes, No</p>
PHYSICAL SAFETY	<p>The next questions will ask about how often something happened to you while at school during the last 30 days. Then, a few questions will ask how often you did something while at school during the last 30 days. Think about what has happened in your classrooms and in the hallways, during lunch and recess, and on the bus.</p> <p>In the last 30 days, how often has the following happened while at school?</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 6. My things (like your clothing, books or bike) were stolen. 7. My things (like your clothing, books or bike) were damaged on purpose. 8. I damaged someone's things just for fun (like their clothing, books or bike). 9. I stole something (like clothing, books or a bike). 10. I told someone I was going to hurt them. <p>Response Options: 0 times, 1 or 2 times, 3 to 5 times, 6 or more times</p>
EXPECTATIONS-BOUNDARIES	<p>These questions will ask you about your school this school year. Some of the questions are about rules. When you see or hear the word “rule,” think about the expectations your teacher has for you in the classroom, or the rules that everyone follows in the school.</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 11. There are clear rules about what students can and can't do. 12. Adults who work in my school have the same rules for all students. 13. The rules at my school are easy to understand. 14. My school lets my parent or guardian know if I have done something wrong. 15. My school lets my parent or guardian know if I'm doing a good job. 16. I feel safe at school. <p>Response Options: Yes, Sometimes, No</p>

EMOTIONAL SAFETY	<p>Some of the next questions are about bullying. Bullying can be electronic (saying or writing mean things by a phone or a computer), verbal (saying mean things), or physical (hurting a person or their things). Think about what has happened in your classrooms and in the hallways, during lunch and recess, and on the bus.</p> <p>In the last 30 days, how often has the following happened while at school?</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none">17. I was called names, made fun of, or picked on in a way that hurt my feelings.18. Other students left me out on purpose or completely ignored me.19. I was hit, kicked, or pushed around by another student.20. Other students told lies about me and tried to make others dislike me.21. I got a scary or hurtful message from another student on a phone, computer or iPad.22. Other students made me feel included in their group of friends. <p>Response Options: 0 times, 1 or 2 times, 3 to 5 times, 6 or more times</p>
ADULT-STUDENT	<p>The next questions will ask you about the teachers and adults in your school this school year, and how they act and talk to students. When you see or hear the word “adult” in these questions, it means someone who works for the school. For example, a teacher, principal, bus driver or classroom helper.</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none">23. My teachers care about me.24. My teachers tell me when I am doing a good job.25. Adults in my school treat students with respect.26. There is an adult at school that I can go to for help with my homework.27. There is an adult at school that I know would help me if I had a problem.28. Students treat adults who work in this school with respect. <p>Response Options: Yes, Sometimes, No</p>
